A Welfare Officer may call out to see you to offer advice and information or to help with a particular problem. The Connections letter is sent out to those people who do not wish to be visited, to enquire as to your well-being.



Link up is a scheme introduced to maintain regular contact with people who may be experiencing loneliness. Janet will ring on a regular basis just for a chat or to offer help and advice.



Domestic Service – this is for people who are unable to do their own housework and have no family to help.



Carewatch is a scheme which allows carers free time for them to pursue activities they may want to undertake whilst the person they are caring for is looked after.



A Hairdressing Grant may be available for people who cannot get out to a salon and have no family to take them. This enables them to have a mobile hairdresser



A Gardening Grant may be available to people who are unable to maintain their garden and have no family who can do it for them.



Re-union Lunches are arranged across the country to allow former colleagues and work-mates to catch up with each other.



Ruskin Lodge is our Respite Care Home which enables beneficiaries, and employees who are carers, to have a rest from their caring role.



In particular cases of hardship a Discretionary Grant may be paid to help people through a difficult time.
